<b>Research paper</b> A complete report on original research and/or clinical studies. Research articles should describe in detail the original and important pieces of work in the fields covered by the Journal. <b>Note:</b> A clear structure is required, which should contain but not confined to the following sections: Abstract, Introduction, Materials and methods, Results, Discussion, Conclusions.	A structured abstract containing Objectives, Methods, Results, Conclusions, and Clinical significance. Max word limit: 500	No requirement	Max of 10	Max of 50
<b>Review Paper</b> Review papers should cover topics that have seen significant development or progress in recent years, with comprehensive depth and a balanced perspective, rather than providing a comprehensive literature survey. <b>Short Communication</b> Short report or announcement of research, usually claiming certain results, which present original and significant material for rapid dissemination. Short Communications are expected to have a higher than average impact on the field rather than report on incremental research. <b>Case report</b> Case Reports are brief reports of individual patients or small cohorts reporting novel findings of unexpected clinical significance.	Unstructured abstract; Max word limit: 150	Max of 2000 words, excluding References, Figures, and Tables	Max of 3	Max of 10
<b>Editorial</b> The editors invite Editorials to discuss a topical issue or a paper published in the Journal and set the	None	Max of 1000 words, excluding References,	Max of 1	Max of 5

<b>Perspective</b> Perspective may focus on current advances and future directions on a topic of translational dental medicine. They are more forward looking and/or speculative than Review papers and may take a narrower field of view.	None	Max of 1000 words, excluding References, Figures, and Tables	Max of 2	Max of 10
<b>Commentary</b> Commentary should be an analysis of recently published articles of particular interest. Most Comments are commissioned, but authors wishing to submit an unsolicited Comment must submit it through the online submission system.
